

- 1. NCAA rules prohibit as institution from employing (on a volunteer or paid basis) an individual associated with a recruited prospective student-athlete at that institution's camps or clinics
- 2. Actions by staff members or athletic representatives that causes a prospective student-athlete to become a recruited prospective student-athlete at that institution include:
 - a. The prospect made an official (paid) visit to Presbyterian College; or
 - b. A staff member of the College had an arranged, in-person, off-campus encounter with the prospective student-athlete or the prospective student athlete's parents, relatives or legal guardians; or
 - c. Presbyterian College has initiated or arranged a telephone contact with the prospect, the prospect's relatives or legal guardian, on more than one occasion for the purpose of recruitment; or
 - d. The prospective student-athlete's attendance at any institutional camp or clinic has been solicited by Presbyterian College (or a representative of the institution's athletics interest); or
 - e. Presbyterian College has provided any recruiting materials to the prospective student- athlete; 0r
 - f. An institutional coaching staff member has had any recruiting contact [including in- person or electronic contact (i.e. telephone calls, video conference, electronic, electronic correspondence)] with the prospective student-athlete (including contact initiated by the prospective student-athlete (including contact initiated by the prospective student-athlete); or
 - g. The prospective student-athlete has received a written or verbal offer of athletically related financial aid from Presbyterian College; or
 - h. The prospective student-athlete has verbally committed to attend Presbyterian College
- 3. A prospect retains recruited status with regard to Presbyterian College until he enrolls at another NCAA institution or has exhausted his eligibility at Presbyterian College.
- 4. Given these regulations, you are required to disclose any association with any prospect who is being recruited or has been recruited by Presbyterian College and still meets the definition of a recruited prospect.

Examples of associations include, but are not limited to, the following examples: parent/guardian, high school/scholastic coach, non-scholastic/AAU coach, personal trainer, advisor, family friend or relative.
